PARISH UPDATE



Last summer the Parish Council, in partnership with St Augustine's Church, started a project to mark the centenary of the ending of World War one by placing a memorial on East Langdon village green.

The project took longer than expected to complete but on 26th June the granite memorial was finally installed.

The inscriptions record the people of the parish who lost their lives during the first or second world wars. The 24 names have been taken from the memorial plaques in St Augustine's Church, East Langdon and St Mary's Church, West Langdon. By displaying the names on the village green we hope that more people may pay their respects and take part in the Remembrance Sunday Services on the 10th November this year and on future occasions.

On Sunday 28th July 2019 a Dedication Service was held to mark the final stage in the project.

Some 30 parishioners and several living relatives of those named on the memorial gathered to share family memories and honour those who lost their lives during the First or Second World Wars.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

East Langdon 20mph Zone—a Polite Reminder

In 2016 the 20mph limit was introduced along The Street in East Langdon in response to safety issues raised by school parents and local residents. Although a partial success, we still hear reports of motorists driving too fast through the village or in some cases, out from the Westside turnings. Please be vigilant!



New Community Warden

St Margaret's and Langdon have been assigned Steve Noddings as our local community warden. Steve is keen to get acquainted with our area and will attend parish council meetings and the East Langdon Coffee mornings as work patterns permit. He can be contacted by phone on 07977 982184 for local non-urgent matters; otherwise use 101 or 999 in the normal way.

East Langdon Village Green

We are in discussion with KCC Highways to clarify the legal position when the parish council and local volunteers install or undertake maintenance works on the green. KCC Highways recognises that local residents may wish to make use of and improve village greens under its ownership but as the registered owner, KCC needs to approve any new works including an accurate record of things that are on the highway along with ownership details and adequate liability cover. As regards public liability cover for volunteers undertaking work, the parish council's insurance policy does include cover providing that it is authorised and certain conditions are met.

Village Ponds

The two ponds in our parish add to the character of the local area but they also serve another purpose, to drain water from the highway. Although a pond may be privately owned, KCC Highways has powers to divert water into a pond and undertake silt clearance as necessary to maintain the drainage facility.

The recent weather patterns of heavy rainfall followed by hot dry summers has resulted in the pond silt traps being clogged up and then water levels becoming very low, causing distress to any wildlife living in the pond. At East Langdon, the residents of Church Mews who collectively own the pond had been in



discussion with KCC Highways to get the silt trap emptied and the pond cleared. KCC required all livestock (fish) to be permanently removed before any work is started and this is where the discussion has stalled. The parish council is now involved and the discussion re-opened with KCC to see if work can be scheduled whilst the pond is very low and (sadly) there are no signs of fish in the water.

Parish Footpaths and Public Rights of Way

In Langdon we are fortunate to have good public footpaths which link into adjacent parishes and wider heritage trails. The parish council is keen to ensure that paths are kept clear and councillors have been asked to check the state of routes in their area. Heritage Watch

Heritage crime is any offence which targets the historic environment. It includes crimes against archaeological sites, churches, castles stately homes and historic shipwrecks. It also includes crimes against cultural property and museum collections.

Heritage crime covers a wide variety of criminal activity which can cause loss or damage to heritage assets forever. These include – architectural theft, in particular the theft of metal and stone, anti-social behaviour, criminal damage, arson, unauthorised excavation and metal detecting (also known as 'night-hawking') damage by vehicles and the trade in illicit cultural property.

Langdon Loathes Litter

In July we reported an interest in voluntary litter-picking around the parish to reduce the amount of rubbish being left in the hedges and roadside verges. To support the initiative, the parish council will purchase some sets of litter picking equipment which residents may wish to borrow for the task. Anyone volunteering to litter-pick along our country lanes should familiarise themselves with KCC's risk assessment guidelines as below:

"Safety of people working on roads, including volunteers is paramount. KCC will not endorse, support or insure volunteer activities taking place on roads of 40 mph or above. This is the standard that KCC has set, although under no legal obligation to do so"



HISTORIC LANGDON—MARTIN MILL RAILWAY STATION



In June 1881 the railway between Dover and Deal was opened, with a station close to the Martin windmill. The station had several sidings, animal pens and a large goods shed to serve the needs of the surrounding rural communities.

In 1934 the separate signal box was closed and the functions transferred inside the booking office.

In the photograph opposite you can see the lever frame signalling controls and the ticket office window behind signalman Reg Howell.

The booking office also housed the local post office and the service window is at the left end of the counter.

The booking office was heated by a cast iron coke stove which made the room warm and cosy during the winter. With the kettle always on the boil, visitors were often invited in to share a cup of tea and catch up on local gossip.

Reg Howell lived in East Langdon and was the main fund-raiser for re-building the parish hall and purchasing the playing field. Working at the station, he never missed an opportunity to promote village events or sell raffles tickets to the travelling public! We remember Reg with great fondness.
