# Have your say!

Langdon Parish Council is conducting a survey of the local community from all four villages to inform a Neighbourhood Plan for the period 2023-2040. It's your chance to tell us how you think your village and parish should evolve over the next decade or two

Neighbourhood planning was introduced by the Localism Act in 2011. The idea behind localism is that decision-making is shared - from national or local government to local communities. Parish councils can produce neighbourhood plans for their local areas, putting in place policies, provision for new facilities, and exploring opportunities for housing, employment, recreation and wildlife.

The survey will be delivered to every residence in the parish inviting households to respond to the questionnaire so that findings are reflective of the parish views. The results from the survey will tell us which aspects of parish life are most important to local people and those areas where change is needed. The Parish Council will use the results to produce a neighbourhood plan setting out the key issues, policies and projects.
