DOVER DISTRICT LOCAL PLAN REVIEW REGULATION 19 SUBMISSION

The Dover District Council Regulation 19 Submission version of its Local Plan is now open for consultation.

This consultation opened on 21st October 2022 and closed for receipt of comments at **5pm on the 9th December 2022.**

RURAL ENGLAND PROSPERITY FUND

DDC has received a grant of £400k. This is meant for the rural communities and is aimed at Business Development, Farm Business Diversification & Community Infrastructure. DCC Tourism & Infrastructure team will be contacting Parish Councils imminently.

FREE STREET DANCE SESSIONS IN DOVER AND DEAL

Girls aged eight and over in the district have been enjoying free street dance sessions organised by DDC. The project is funded by the charity, StreetGames, which aims to change lives and transform communities through the power of sport. The lessons have proved to be really successful in Dover and are now taking place in Deal. With teaching that includes learning various street dance moves and exercises that will strengthen joints and improve their flexibility, the participants are learning a street dance routine as part of a group too.

Supporting Communities - DDC Gives More Than £230k in Community Grant

Community groups in the district have been given a winter boost of over £110k in the latest round of Dover District Council's Community Grants scheme – meaning the scheme has allocated more than £230k to over 130 groups in the area this year. This week, the Appraisal Panel allocated over £110k to 66 groups in the winter round of the popular grants' initiative. Earlier this year, DDC announced payments of over £120k to 70 groups in the summer round.

Applications open for Community Transport Grant

Charities, resident groups and parish or town councils are now able to apply for funding from Kent County Council's (KCC) Community Transport Grant. This year £450,000 is available to go towards local schemes which provide invaluable services to residents who have difficulty accessing public transport.

The council has provided grants for community transport schemes for a number of years but this year has made additional funding available for groups to bid for to try to help communities impacted by changes to their bus service.

Applications are now open and should be submitted before the deadline on 15th January 2023 but we have asked KCC for an extension to this deadline.

DDC Completes Land Assembly for Bench Street Redevelopment

Dover District Council (DDC) has acquired the freehold of properties at 8, 10, 11 and 14 Bench Street in Dover, completing a programme of land assembly that brings the regeneration of the area a step closer. DDC already owns 15 Bench Street and the Bench Street car park.

Acquiring the properties is an important step in the council's bid to secure around £20m from the Government's Levelling-Up Fund for the 'Dover Beacon' project which will see the comprehensive redevelopment of the area. The proposals for Bench Street include:

- 2,000m² educational campus for the creative and digital industries
- 690m² facilities for small/medium businesses
- 800m² green space next to the River Dour
- Improving sustainable transport with additional electric bicycle hubs, as an expansion of the current Dover cycle hire scheme
- Retention of some of the current parking
- Potential for residential development on the western side of the site.

Bench Street is ideally situated as a thoroughfare between Dover waterfront, the St James retail and leisure development, and the recently remodelled Market Square leading to the town's traditional high street.

A decision on the council's bid to the Levelling-Up Fund is due by the end of this year.
