ASSETS OF COMMUNITY VALUE

Whilst browsing through the on-line Dover Express archives I came across this article:

"WEST LANGDON. Darts Match. The Rose Inn team visited the Four Bells, East **Langdon**, on Wednesday, and won all three games.

The winning team was: H.Philpott, P.Giles, G.Underdown, J.Heads and the scorer, H.Miller.
Friday 15 January 1937"

Mentioned here are two of the original four pubs in Langdon. Now only The Lantern Inn (formerly The Wheatsheaf) remains open. The East Langdon village shop and Butcher's shop in Martin Mill have long gone. Each provided a community service and

opportunities for residents to meet.

Since 2011, The Localism Act gives local communities the opportunity to bid for buildings and land that are defined as community assets when the owner wishes to sell them. This might include a local pub, green space, or other amenity which contributes to the social wellbeing or social interests of the local community. Such assets are being identified and included in the Neighbourhood Plan. The Lantern Inn at Martin is of particular interest as and when it might be sold. Other sites had been suggested during the Neighbourhood Plan 2022 questionnaire.

MARTIN DEFIBRILLATOR PROJECT

Martin residents raised money towards a defibrillator, which when added to funding from KCC and the Parish Council, was sufficient to buy one. For public use, it is located by the Lantern's car park entrance, housed in a bright yellow cabinet. The Lantern has generously agreed to run power to the unit, and local residents installed it. A community project well done!



LANGDON PLAYING FIELD

Our playing field provides leisure, sports and recreational facilities on this 4 acre site for Langdon parish and surrounding communities. Registered in 1979 as a charity, the land is held in trust for the benefit of all local inhabitants.

At the recent AGM, the five long-standing local volunteers agreed to remain on the management committee but more <u>younger</u> residents are desperately needed to help keep this much-valued community asset in good and safe order.

The trust has no regular income and relies on annual maintenance grants from Langdon Parish Council.

At present two play items are out-of-service, one being the Cyclops Rope End Swing seat which is £1150 to replace and we do not have the funds.

We are appealing to local residents to help in fundraising to get essential



maintenance underway. The playing field is Gift-Aid registered with HMRC so we can reclaim tax refunds on donations.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Langdon Neighbourhood Development Plan

A new round of funding has been announced by the Government which will help Langdon continue with our Neighbourhood Development Plan. The need for affordable housing in Langdon will be assessed as part of the plan and we will be seeking advice from The Kent Housing Group, including a local housing needs survey.

Public Rights of Ways (PROWs) in Langdon

Our public paths and bridleways form an important recreational network across the countryside, being enjoyed by local residents and visitors alike. After the harvesting period, footpaths and bridleways which cross fields may be ploughed up during cultivation but must be restored (marked out) within 14 days. (Footpaths 1 metre width, bridleways 2m). Field edge PROWs should never be cultivated. The GOV.UK/PROWs website has the detailed information about this topic. Please report any footpath issues by emailing our parish clerk.

Dog Fouling on Footpaths

There have been numerous reports of dog waste not being cleared up from the public footpath areas by Langdon Primary School and across to Hollands Hill. The DDC Dog Warden will be monitoring these areas and a new Litter Waste Bin is being proposed at the top of Westside near the school to help keep that location clean. Hopefully this will stop dog waste bags and fouling being left along the waysides and footpath routes.

Langdon Wildlife Area Projects

A proposal to encourage wildlife spaces in Langdon was discussed and backed by the parish council at the July council meeting. Pippa Foulds (local East Langdon resident) presented an environmental project to create wild flower areas on East Langdon village green, starting with 2 trial areas. Parts of The Fostall green space at West Langdon are also left as seasonal wildlife areas. Martin Mill Railway Station Car Parking Issues

Residents will be encouraged to display local parking permits in their cars during September to gauge usage of local "on-street" parking in Martin Mill. The data and photographs will form supporting evidence including usage of station car parking in future discussions with southeastern regional representatives.

New Kent Police Neighbourhood Policy Model

The parish council has recently received a report from PC 12757 Sophie Bramble, Deal Town Beat Officer, who is a member of the Dover Community Safety Unit. A new Neighbourhood Policing (NHP) Model has been implemented which has significant changes including the loss of many of our current PCSOs.

The new model will provide named officers for each ward in the Dover District but at present it has gone live with less than the required number of officers. Currently, this means that each NHP officer has a vast area containing many wards, and even more parishes.

PC Sophie Bramble is the named officer for Deal, Walmer and Kingsdown, plus St Margaret's through to Guston. Another officer is supporting her but also covers Sandwich. Sophie and her team will be doing their very best to provide a quality service to the community and as new officers come onto the team, wards will be subject to change and hopefully the service they can provide will increase.

There are now five defibrillator units in our parish as registered at www.defibfinder.com.

Four are available 24/7, the fifth being at Langdon Primary School and accessible during school hours. The parish council owns and maintains the first three as shown in the notice opposite.

They are checked regularly by local volunteers and expendable items (pads and batteries) are purchased from the Council's budget.
